

Sports sector schemes in India

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Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports is the nodal agency for Sports sector in India. This topic is important for UPSC Prelims and Mains.

Khelo India Programme

- It is a Central Sector Scheme with 12 components and achieving twin objectives of NYP, 2001: broadbasing sports and achieving excellence in sports.
- It was introduced to revive the sports culture in India at grass root level.
- Talented players will be given annual financial assistance of Rs. 5 lakh/ vear for 8 vears.
- It was launched after merging Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan, Urban Sports Infra Scheme (USIS) and National Sports Talent Search System Programme.
- 12 components include: Community coaching, annual sports competition, State level centers, sports infra, physical fitness, women, PwD, peace and development and indigenous/tribal games.

Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan

- 1. It replaced Panchayat Yuva Krida/ Khel Abhiyan (focused on sports
- infrastructure at village and block level.

 2. RGKA is a Centrally **Sponsored** Scheme. For **block level sports** complex.
- 3. Promote sports, increase access, competitions,
- 4. Construct sports complexes in every rural block or Panchayat.
- 5. 11 outdoor and 5 indoor games, 3 sports trainer with 1 female.
- 6. Assistance for sports equipments and self defense training for women.

Sports Authority of India (SAI), 1984¹

- It is a society under Societies Registration Act, 1860.
- Come and Play Scheme: by SAI in collaboration with MoYA&S at different SAI stadium complexes in Delhi.

World Anti Doping Agency (WADA):, 1999

- WADA was set up as an independent, international agency with the aim of creating an environment in world sport that is free of doping.
- HQ is at Montreal, Canada and NADA is set up on the lines of WADA.



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• A new Code was introduced in 2015 with ramifications for athletes, sporting organisations and medical practitioners who deal with high-level athletes.

National Anti Doping Agency (NADA), 2005

- It is a society under SRA, 1860, set up in 2005 with a mandate for Dope free sports in India.
- Objectives: Implement anti doping rules as per WADA code, regulate dope control programme, promote education and research and create awareness.

- Started in 2002.
- 5 lakhs rupees awarded to the sportspersons for Lifetime achievement.

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Started in 1985.

5 lakhs rupees given to honor the coaches of India.

Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Trophy

- Started in 1956-57.
- It is given to a University and it is a rolling trophy.

Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puraskar

- Started in 2009. No cash award here.
- It is given to entities other than sportspersons and coaches.
